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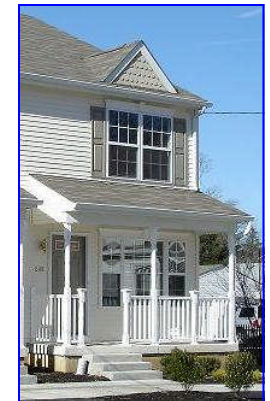

TREATMENT

Treatment Team

Treatment Planning

- Treatment plans are established on the 1st day of admission and again on the 90th day of treatment
- Case Review and Placement meetings held on the 14th day of treatment.

To facilitate each resident's program throughout their stay we strongly request that families and support systems (DYFS, CMO, YCM) actively participate in all aspects of the child's program from referral, pre-admission and throughout treatment. Family/caregiver and support systems participation is also expected throughout the pre-placement process, treatment and discharge planning period in implementing a strong discharge/aftercare service plan.

DISCHARGE No resident will be discharged because of issues noted and disclosed during the referral process. Preemptive discharge outside of the agreed upon service plan may occur due to safety concerns for the following criteria:

- Buy, use, sell, or distribute illegal substances, or illegal acts in the community (robbery, sexual assault, etc),
- Display violent or aggressive behavior posing a considered danger to self, others, the community that does not respond to program interventions,
- Becomes pregnant.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Referral packets for admission much contain the following:

- Standard Out of Home Referral Summary
- All Case and Authorization Numbers for Client: KC#, ValueOptions Authorization #, Medicaid # (Authorization numbers will be gotten from the CSA by DCBHS. There will be no contact between the CSA & the agency until the youth has been discharged to her longer term placement.)
- Evaluation(s); Psychological, Psychiatric or Bio-Psychosocial
- If fire setting is in the recent history a Fire Setting Evaluation is required.
- Relevant Court Orders (as applicable)
- FSIQ of 70 or above. FSIQ is taken from either a Psychological evaluation and an IEP.
- Immunization Record and PPD
- Negative Pregnancy Test

Admissions are usually scheduled between 10:00 AM & 2:00 PM. Once pre-admission process is complete, TCH will respond as to acceptance or denial of a candidate within three business days.



THE CHILDREN'S HOME (TCH) HUNTER HOUSE IS A FIVE-BED DETENTION ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM FOR ADJUDICATED FEMALE ADOLESCENTS, AGES 10-17, IN NEED OF RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT AND INDIVIDUAL, GROUP AND FAMILY THERAPY TO STABILIZE BEHAVIOR PRIOR TO PERMANENT PLACEMENT.

CASE MANAGEMENT IS PROVIDED BY A MASTER'S LEVEL CLINICIAN WITH SUPERVISION BY A LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER (LCSW). BACHELOR'S LEVEL RESIDENTIAL COUNSELOR'S PROVIDE DIRECT PROGRAMMING AND SUPERVISION OF RESIDENTS DURING ALL NON-SCHOOL HOURS.
